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ELECTION ADMINISTRATION'S PREVENTIVE MEASURES FOR SAFE ELECTORAL ENVIRONMENT

- The Election Administration has a successful experience in holding elections amid the pandemic (2020 parliamentary election)
- Preventive measures the Election Administration applied testing employees with antigen rapid diagnostic tests (Ag-RDT) on COVID-19 weekly and on E-day (2021 municipal elections)
- Organizing vaccination process for Election Administration employees (all levels)

Decrees define sanitary-hygienic rules for voters being in isolation, penitentiary institutions, and inpatient treatment facilities, as well as an epidemiological protocol for E-day

A new addition to the regulation to safeguard the electoral process (rapid/PCR test results)

Setting criteria for polling process such as polling buildings with natural ventilation and large halls for polling process and for vote recounts (the so-called tabulation centers)



Certain changes prompted by electoral reform (random recounts of 5 polling stations per electoral district)



VOTER INFORMATION CAMPAIGN – KEY TO VOTER PARTICIPATION IN ELECTIONS DURING THE PANDEMIC

- The CEC runs a large-scale voter information campaign
- Voter information campaign includes TV and radio advertisements as well as social media
- The campaign also targets self-isolated voters informing them on how to vote in upcoming elections
