### Fostering Development of Political Parties in Georgia

A new party-financing scheme

On 30 December 2008, parliament of Georgia adopted amendments to the Law on Political Parties. Adoption of the law was preceded by intensive dialogue between opposition parties and the ruling party under the auspices of The Anti-Crisis Council<sup>1</sup> (hereinafter Council) auspices.

The amendments put in place the following key principles:

RESTORATION OF BUDGETARY FUNDING FOR POLITICAL PARTIES WHO REFUSED TO SERVE THEIR TENURE IN PARLIAMENT AFTER THE MAY 2008 PARLIAMENTARY ELECTIONS.

Financing of those political parties will be resumed from January1, 2009 pursuant to old formula of party financing, which includes a basic part, as well as an additional sum assigned for MPs elected through proportional system and the component relevant to the votes received.

### BUDGETARY FUNDING FOR ADDITIONAL OPPOSITIONAL PARTIES

In line with existing laws, until now, nine parties<sup>2</sup> were recipients of financing from the state budget. The new scheme makes it possible for launching of budgetary funding for six additional parties<sup>3</sup>

### SIGNIFICANT RAISE OF BUDGETARY FUNDS AVAILABLE FOR OPPOSITION PARTIES AND DECREASE OF FUNDING FOR THE RULING UNITED NATIONAL MOVEMENT

476,442GEL will be allocated for opposition parties additionally. In parallel, budgetary funding for the ruling United National Movement decreased by 108,000GEL.

1,040,000 GEL will be allocated for supporting research activities, conferences, business trips, seminars and activities carried out by political parties. This sum will be distributed in proportion to the basic funds assigned directly from the state budget. Furthermore, 1,040,000 GEL will be allocated for non-governmental and think tank organizations affiliated with political parties.

The amendments result in the following monetary changes for specific political actors:

- Funding of the United Opposition bloc (formerly composed of nine parties) will amount1,201,604 GEL, including 905,604 GEL from the state budget and 296,000 GEL from the fund.
- Funding of Labor Party of Georgia will amount 497,338 GEL, including 391,338 GEL from the state budget and 106,000 GEL from the fund.
- Funding of the United National Movement will amount 2,040,185 GEL, including 1,827,185 GEL from the state budget and 213 000 GEL from the fund.

As a result of alteration of the existing formula of party-financing, a political party with more than 30 members in the parliament elected through the proportional system will receive 100GEL for each next (above 30) member, instead of 600GEL. As a result, funding for the United national Movement, with 48 MPs elected through proportional system, is reduced by 108,000GEL. Before this amendment the Untied National Movement received 1,935,185GEL from the state budget.

- Funding of the Republican Party will amount 354,748GEL, including 248,748 GEL from the state budget and 106,000GEL from the fund.
- Funding of Industry Will Save Georgia will amount 345,947GEL, including 239,947GEL from the state budget and 106,000GEL from the fund.
- Funding for the Christian Democratic Movement will amount 786,651GEL, including 573,651 GEL from the state budget and 213,000GEL from the fund.






## Financing from the Fund




