b. Venice Forum Newsgroup

The Newsgroup enables courts to actively share information with each other, e.g. to make online announcements on changes to their composition, on recent key judgments and to make various requests for general information.

The Newsgroup is also used by the Secretariat to inform liaison officers about accessions to the World Conference on Constitutional Justice (WCCJ) and appointments of Presidents to Courts.

Liaison officers are alerted every Friday at 4 p.m. CET about new items that are added to the Newsgroup.

Liaison officers, who are new or who have not received these alerts or who cannot access the Venice Forum, are invited to contact the Secretariat.

c. Constitutional Justice Media Observatory

The Constitutional Justice Media Observatory is sent in the form of an e-mail to members and liaison officers who have subscribed and presents information on news agency dispatches and press articles relating to constitutional courts and equivalent bodies.

The information presented results from an Internet search in English and in French and does not purport to provide a complete picture of any decision or development of constitutional justice in general. Although the Venice Commission cannot vouch for the accuracy of the information sent, it can add any information provided by the court concerned or remove an article, upon request.

Liaison officers may register for the e-mails from the Observatory.

6. CODICES database

a. Upgrading the CODICES database

Participants will be informed about progress made in replacing the CODICES database with new software.

b. Updating and indexing constitutions, laws and descriptions in CODICES

Participants will be informed about the progress made in updating constitutions, laws on and descriptions of courts.

7. Publication of the e-Bulletin on Constitutional Case-Law

a. Special Bulletin on "Forms and Limits of Judicial Deference: The Case of Constitutional Courts"

As for previous congresses, Resolution III of the Circle of Presidents of the Conference of European Constitutional Courts (Chisinau/online 25 May 2022) requested the Venice Commission to prepare a special Bulletin for the XIXth Congress of the Conference of European Constitutional Courts (CECC) in May 2024 on the topic "Forms and Limits of Judicial Deference: The Case of Constitutional Courts". Even if these special bulletins are requested by the CECC, they always cover all member and observer states of the Venice Commission. Therefore, all liaison officers of the JCCJ are invited to contribute *précis* that are relevant to the topic. The Venice Commission Secretariat will make a selection of cases that already exist in CODICES first. It will subsequently ask the liaison officers to confirm this choice and to either amend these *précis* or possibly to provide additional *précis*.

This contribution of *précis* to the Venice Commission is not to be mixed with the national reports from CECC members that are to be submitted to the Presidency of the CECC (the Constitutional Court of the Republic of Moldova) by 11 August 2023. The deadline for the JCCJ liaison officers will be 30 September 2023.

b. Regular e-Bulletins

The Secretariat will invite liaison officers to discuss any issues concerning the preparation of contributions to the e-Bulletin: headnotes, indexing, cross-references, etc.

Liaison officers are invited to share their experience and suggestions for improvement.

8. Documentation Centre on Constitutional Justice / Library

The Library of the Documentation Centre on Constitutional Justice (CoCentre), which is composed exclusively of donations, mostly from constitutional courts and equivalent bodies can no longer receive paper bulletins from Courts, which exist on-line, as it no longer has the room to store them. The library can continue to accept individual monographs and periodicals that do not exist on-line (please inform the Secretariat when this is the case). Where available, the Secretariat would prefer to receive PDF versions of books, which do not take up space and can be made available on-line.
