The terms of office of the President, the Vice-Presidents, the members of the Bureau as well as the Chairs and Vice-Chairs of the Sub-Commissions expire. At its October session the Commission elected the Committee of Wise Persons to prepare the elections.

The Committee of Wise Persons suggests the following amendment to Article 17a.2 of the Rules of Procedure to provide for more flexibility:

"Article 17a

Scientific Council

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2. The Commission shall decide every two years upon the composition of the Scientific Council. The First Vice-President may be elected as Chair of the Scientific Council."

Replacing : "2. The Commission shall decide every two years upon the composition of the Scientific Council, which will be chaired by the First Vice-President."

The Commission is invited to approve this modification to the Rules of Procedure.

In addition the Committee of Wise Persons will present the proposed list of candidates for the various offices. The election itself will take place on Saturday morning.
